SDG 1 Targets

1. Financial Aid for Low-Income Students:

AzTU provides substantial financial aid and scholarships to students from low-income backgrounds, including refugees, disabled individuals, and families of Karabakh war veterans. In 2023, 60% of students received some form of financial assistance, making higher education more accessible. The Educational Student Loans Fund (ESLF) also plays a key role in supporting underprivileged students

2. University Anti-Poverty Programs:

- AzTU has specific policies aimed at admitting students from the bottom 20% of household income groups, offering government-backed scholarships and prioritizing financial support for these students.
- The university sets graduation/completion targets for students from low-income backgrounds and provides academic counseling and financial aid to ensure their academic success.
- AzTU offers additional support such as free meals, housing, transportation, and legal services for students from low-income families.
- AzTU runs initiatives like tutoring, mentorship, and financial aid packages to help low-income students complete their studies successfully.
- The university extends support to international students from low- and lower-middle-income countries, offering scholarships and grants to enable them to pursue their education.

3. Community Anti-Poverty Programs:

- AzTU supports local communities by providing mentorship, workshops, and resources to help start financially and socially sustainable businesses.
- The university collaborates with partners to offer financial assistance, including micro-loans and seed funding, to help local entrepreneurs establish sustainable businesses.
- AzTU organizes training programs aimed at improving access to basic services such as healthcare,
 education, and digital literacy for disadvantaged populations.
- AzTU participates in policymaking at local, regional, national, and global levels to implement programs that address poverty in all its dimensions.

Current situation

Azerbaijan Technical University (AzTU) has demonstrated a strong commitment to reducing poverty, aligning its efforts with the Sustainable Development Goal 1: No Poverty. The university offers comprehensive financial support to students from disadvantaged backgrounds, including those from low-income families, refugees, and individuals affected by the Karabakh conflict. In 2023, 60% of AzTU's student population received some form of financial assistance, reflecting the institution's dedication to ensuring that education remains accessible to those in need. However, only 246 students from low-income families



currently benefit from targeted financial aid programs, suggesting room for expanding the scope of support to reach more economically disadvantaged students.

AzTU implements various strategies to support low-income students, including government-backed scholarships, tuition waivers, and educational loans through the Educational Student Loans Fund (ESLF). For example, students from the most economically vulnerable 20% of households are given priority access to these financial programs, ensuring that financial barriers do not hinder their academic pursuits. Furthermore, the university has set clear graduation and completion targets for these students, providing academic counseling, mentorship, and additional financial aid to help them complete their studies. This is evident from the university's various scholarship initiatives, as highlighted on their website, including the prestigious Heydar Aliyev scholarships and special government-funded programs aimed at supporting low-income students.

In addition to addressing student needs, AzTU is actively engaged in community anti-poverty programs that extend beyond the university. It plays a key role in fostering local entrepreneurship and sustainable business development, particularly in rural areas, by offering mentorship, training workshops, and access to financial resources. These efforts are bolstered by collaborations with local and international partners, who provide grants, micro-loans, and seed funding to individuals and small businesses. For instance, the university has organized multiple training programs to enhance local business skills, including workshops on "Future Professions" and other vocational training sessions

AzTU's impact on improving access to basic services is another notable contribution to poverty reduction. The university organizes community-based training programs that focus on improving access to healthcare, digital literacy, and vocational skills for disadvantaged populations. In particular, AzTU has partnered with organizations to conduct workshops on health awareness and practical skills development, such as their collaboration with the Azerbaijan Red Crescent Society and other local initiatives. These activities ensure that vulnerable communities are not only better equipped to access essential services but also empowered to lift themselves out of poverty through education and skill-building.

Moreover, AzTU is involved in policymaking at the local, national, and international levels to address poverty in a broader context. By contributing to policy dialogues and frameworks, the university helps shape strategies that aim to eradicate poverty in all its dimensions. AzTU's participation in these efforts is further supported by its internal policies and programs that encourage innovation and entrepreneurship among students, as well as its commitment to providing financial support to international students from low- and lower-middle-income countries.



Future goals

- Increase Financial Aid Access: AzTU aims to expand financial aid programs, including scholarships and loans, to a higher percentage of low-income and vulnerable students, ensuring broader access to higher education for those in need.
- **Strengthen Support for Graduation**: The university plans to enhance its support systems—such as mentorship, counseling, and academic assistance—to improve the graduation rates of students from the lowest income groups, fostering equitable outcomes.
- Broaden Community Outreach: AzTU intends to further engage in local community initiatives that support sustainable business development and provide training for improved access to basic services. This includes organizing additional workshops on entrepreneurship and essential skills for community members.
- **Expand Global Support Initiatives**: By increasing scholarships and subsidies for international students from low-income countries, AzTU will continue to support diverse economic backgrounds, promoting inclusive education globally.
- Participate in Policy Advocacy: AzTU seeks to strengthen its role in policymaking at multiple levels
 to address poverty comprehensively, contributing to frameworks that improve living conditions,
 access to services, and socioeconomic support in disadvantaged communities.
